Mayor's Fall Cleanup is October 23! Streets are Streams – Clean Water Starts In Your Own Yard!

Acting Public Works Director Alfred H. Foxx announced today that Mayor Stephanie Rawlings-Blake's 2010 Fall Cleanup will take place Saturday, October 23, 2010 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. The theme for this year's clean up is *Streets are Streams – Clean Water Starts In Your Own Yard!* Special emphasis will be put on cleaning streets, gutters and alleys, and raising awareness that litter and trash in the streets ends up in our streams, our harbor and the Chesapeake Bay.

Join your neighbors and choose a location that needs a special cleanup. Community representatives should call 311 to register.

Containers will be available for debris collection on a first call basis. Participating communities are asked to bag and stack debris at a designated collection location so that it can be picked up on Monday, October 25th. The debris pickup location should be provided when participants register at 311. Limited supplies will be made available to participating communities.
